As we are over a year into this war we didn't start, while fighting on multiple fronts, many Israelis feel the water level could soon be overwhelming.

As the war continues, Israelis are pommeled with pain, grief, and trauma. In recent meetings and local conferences, I have witnessed the conflict's devastating effects. It has taken a tremendous toll on families of hostages, on those who have lost loved ones in battle or from unexpected attacks, and especially on young children who are separated for months on end from parents and family members who are serving in the military.

Fear has gripped many people in Israel. Families and small businesses continue to struggle because of the war's detrimental financial impact. Israelis are still deeply divided about judicial reform and Orthodox religious conscription. Without God in their lives, there is only a growing hopelessness on the horizon for many people in this nation.

Even if our country reaches a ceasefire deal, the illusion of peace — fragile as it was previously — is shattered for almost everyone here. Most Israelis now prefer force to platitudes. Many have adopted a Middle Eastern saying, "Peace is made with the strong." This means paying the high price that is required for us to regain our powerful deterrence in the violent neighborhood that surrounds us.

Even for Believers,* it can take time to shift our perspective away from anguish and toward hope — to lift our eyes to the Lord Who provides our help (Ps. 121:1). When we do this, however, we stop dwelling on the physical devastation that the devil sows and instead find a new way to pray, proclaiming God's sovereignty over our circumstances. The authority of God's Word fuels and empowers this kind of prayer. When we pray in this way, we can rest in the victory that the Lord will bring as He watches over Israel (Ps. 121:4) and is with His people everywhere (Ps. 23:4; Matt. 28:20; Rom. 8:38–39; Phil. 4:6–7).

I am grateful for the opportunity to write the monthly *Personal Letter*, where I share a personal perspective about life in the Holy Land. In reading it, you can discover what is happening here spiritually, and know how to support the people of Israel through your ongoing, targeted prayers.

Thank you for standing with us.

Sarah, please know that Kirsten and I are praying for you, your family, and all Israelis. Our hearts, minds, and prayers are with you. Thank you for the update.

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

peace and security for the Middle East, and to uphold our shared values. On behalf of the Jewish and democratic State of Israel, and all our people, I wish you much success."

Israeli National Security Minister Itamar Ben-Gvir retweeted his own post from July 14 stating, "God Bless Trump," with the fresh caption "Yessss," accompanied by images of the Israeli and American flags.

Why President Donald Trump is Good for Israel

On January 20, Donald Trump will be sworn in as the 47th president of the United States. Israel has a distinct interest in Trump's victory. In his first term, Trump was one of the most pro-Israel presidents in U.S. history. Many Israelis consider him an ardent supporter of Israel who works to promote its interests.

Here are several reasons why Israel needs President Trump again:

Firm support for Israel and its security

— Trump is one of the American leaders who expressed unequivocal and uncompromising support for Israel's security. In his first term, he moved the U.S. embassy to Jerusalem — a historic breakthrough in recognizing Jerusalem as Israel's capital. Trump also removed the U.S. from the nuclear agreement with Iran, and imposed extensive sanctions on the Islamic regime. A tough attitude toward Iran — Trump took an aggressive approach toward Iran,

imposing heavy economic sanctions that reduced its ability to finance terrorist organizations. This weakened the ability of both Hezbollah and Hamas to pose a significant threat to Israel. Because Iran remains a primary threat to Israel, we hope and pray that the Trump administration will continue to exert economic and political pressure on the Iranian regime.

Deepening of economic cooperation —

Trump's first term brought a growing economic cooperation between the U.S. and Israel. He encouraged American investments in Israel and created collaborations in areas including technology, security, and medical innovation. A continued partnership can help strengthen Israel's economy and create more jobs in Israel, especially in the high-tech and defense industries.

Influence on the United Nations (UN) and international organizations —

Trump took a critical stance toward the UN and many international institutions that often have a critical stance toward Israel. He withdrew the U.S. from the UN Human Rights Council due to what he called their "anti-Israeli bias." This gave Israel important political support in the fight against unfair condemnations in international institutions. Trump's return may continue to contribute to Israel's defense in the diplomatic arena.

Trump's great victory is an important reminder of the strong and courageous alliance between Israel and the U.S. that, God willing, will go back to its great days. God bless Israel. God bless America.

New Every Morning

People often say, "I'm so ready to be done with this past year!" I never fully identified with that sentiment until 2024. Truthfully, I've never been happier to welcome a new year.

Since the beginning of last year, I've grieved over the Israelis who have been hostages in Gaza (for over a year now). I also mourn for the many Israelis who have lost their lives — not only from Hamas's atrocities on October 7, 2023, but also during Israel's ongoing wars against Iran's terrorist proxies. In addition, I have agonized with everyone in Israel who lives under constant threat of rocket and missile attacks from Israel's enemies.

Then in March, my father, a pillar of strength and wisdom, succumbed to failing kidneys. His death left a void in our family. Only 20 days later, my only brother suddenly left this world. In August, we experienced the tragic loss

of an unborn grandchild. These deaths were painful reminders of life's fragility.

Now, my family has the ongoing struggle of caring for my mother, who is fighting dementia. Many of you understand this daily battle, and this shared experience brings us closer. Yet even when we know that others go through some of our same losses and difficulties, this awareness doesn't always make the personal struggle easier.

To cap off the challenging year, in November we had to euthanize Snickers, our 20-year-old cat.

So, how do we navigate life's difficult seasons?

We take them one day at a time.

On the drive home, after saying our goodbyes to my father on his deathbed, I told my mother, "Mom, we'll take it hour by hour until the end of the day. Then, we'll focus on surviving day by day until we've made it through a full week. After





that, somehow, we'll continue in this world without him by our side."

Throughout 2024, I've often recalled God's continuous mercies: "Because of the mercies of Adonai we will not be consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning! Great is Your faithfulness" (Lam. 3:22–23 TLV). This passage has been my anchor in many storms, a constant reminder that even in the darkest moments, God's compassion and faithfulness never waver.


Every day, we must remind ourselves that the harsh realities of this world will not overtake us. Our Lord is always with us (Matt. 28:20). He will never leave or forsake us (Heb. 13:5). His compassions are new every single morning.

Do you, like me, need "strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow"?

This common need connects us in our struggles. Couldn't we all use renewed strength as we begin this new year? We can only endure the trials of this world through the peace, hope, and strength that come from our Lord.

May all of the Israeli hostages return home in 2025. May the memory of those we have lost be a blessing to everyone. May you experience more joy than sorrow. Throughout this year, let us continue to "pray for the peace of Jerusalem" (Ps. 122:6).





That's probably a title you never expected to see in the *Levitt Letter*. Biblical kosher law (which differs greatly from today's kosher) is found in Leviticus chapter 11. In this chapter, God identifies clean and unclean animals — those that were acceptable or forbidden for Israel to eat. Note verse 9: "Of all the creatures living in the water

of the seas and the streams

you may eat any
that have fins and
scales." That means
you can remove half
of your sushi platter
— no crustaceans,
squids, or eels.

Now that you know about kosher, here's more about the lobsters. For months, we prayed fervently,

training the gang

asking God for insight about our next television series. When God replied, His answer was quite shocking: Don't go to Israel.* That seemed odd, since God usually leads us to Israel, even in the middle of wars. But God's ways are not like our ways.

Throughout Scripture, God often subverts man's prejudices and presumptions. He used women to bring victory for His people. The Lord commanded Ezekiel to cook his food over human feces. And who can forget when God instructed the Prophet Hosea to marry a prostitute? Later, Yeshua healed on the Sabbath, allowed His disciples to eat with unwashed hands, and dined with tax collectors and sinners. (Personally, we would never invite the IRS for dinner!)

So, as we considered God's reply, we didn't ask "why." Instead, we asked "what" — What did He want us to do? You should always be ready to say "yes" whenever you ask God that question.

Here's what the Lord showed us. Before Yeshua ascended into Heaven. He commanded His followers to go into all the world and preach the Gospel the "Good News" — to every creature (Mark 16:15). Clearly, the disciples never thought that their Messiah intended such "creatures" to include lobsters (that is, gentiles). So instead of going "out," years passed while the Apostles remained "in" Israel. But along came the murderous Pharisee Shaul (Saul) — the most law-abiding, religious zealot of them all. He hated the new Jewish Believers and attempted to kill them. Soon enough, however, Yeshua blinded him and said something like this: "Hey, rabbi. I've got a job for you. You will become My very first Lobsterman!" And the rest is history.

That's right, God sent your beloved
Bearded Bible Brothers to the lobster
capital of the world — Rockland, Maine

— to teach about first century Believers against the backdrop of contemporary Lobstermen. We were accompanied by Pastor Mike Ferland — our local fieldguide — and an ensemble of lobstermen, evangelists, missionaries, teachers, and even Messianic recording artist Joshua Aaron. With their assistance, we unraveled the mystery of Yeshua's call for His disciples to become "fishers of men" and considered the trailblazing ways of the Apostle Paul, the original Lobsterman. As the Church Age barrels toward a cataclysmic finale, there's much we can learn in the Book of Acts from the first Church. Their example in witnessing to the lost, along with empowering and discipling Yeshua's followers, can prepare us in the Body of Messiah for our glorious future.

At a recent prophecy conference, Hal Lindsey made the most interesting statement. He said simply, "The purpose of the Tribulation Period is to convert the Jews."

I certainly like the idea of bringing the Jews to their Messiah. In fact, it's my life's work. And I certainly don't disagree with Brother Lindsey on this or almost any other statement he has ever made. But with that said, I must also point out that the Tribulation Period is also a time of salvation for the gentiles. In fact, although it is not usually widely published, the Tribulation will probably be the most vital seven years of conversion to Christ that the world will experience since the days of Paul.

I surmise this from the fact that 144,000 Jewish people are to be converted immediately (see Rev. 7:4, etc.). Then, these people go to testify of Christ wherever they can. Evidently, these witnesses thoroughly cover the gentile nations because, when the Lord returns, He will set up a Judgment Seat only for those of that seven-year period.

Most of us are familiar with the Lord's statement in Matthew 25:40: "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these My brethren, ye have done it unto Me." But perhaps we overlook the context. It is somewhat of an "immigration office" into the coming Kingdom for those people who demonstrated their faith by showing kindness to the 144.000.

Obviously, when these Jewish Believers come through a city, they are all outlaws in the antiChrist's society. Often the police will be close behind them. When they knock on a door or approach to testify in the streets, those who encounter them have a choice. If they have a heart for Christ, they will assist these testifiers however they can — especially providing food and clothing, as the Lord notes in the passage.

They will also visit imprisoned Believers, as the Lord also points out. But if they are rank unbelievers, they will, of course, think of themselves first — and turn away the Jewish testifiers. Thus, these — "the least" of the Lord's "brethren" — will be forsaken by those whom they

approach with the gift of eternal life. But those who turn them away will themselves forsake the Kingdom and eternity with God!

The force of Lindsey's statement is that the 144,000 would naturally go "to the Jew first" (Rom. 1:16), as we are all supposed to do. The difference between those testifiers and today's Church is that they really will fulfill that verse and start their witnessing in the Jewish community. God knows that is the most efficient way to reach out to the gentiles. Eventually, a veritable army of Jewish evangelists will visit all countries of the world, it seems, since the Lord will find so many to be sheep rather than goats when He returns.

It won't be a simple task to testify to today's Israelis. They can be very opinionated and arrogant. The Orthodox among them are practically conducting a civil war against those whom they consider unbelievers. The sad part is that they're all unbelievers so far as the Messiah is concerned, and fighting among themselves isn't helping. I think the Orthodox will eventually commit what TIME magazine once called "monopoly suicide," just as certain doctors and certain lawyers (and certain


TV preachers) have done. They will be universally disliked and dealt with only as a matter of necessity. They will pull down their own walls upon themselves, much like Samson did in the Philistine temple.

I guess it's only fair to add that the Muslims have far greater internal strife caused by their own "Orthodox." Certainly, the clerics of Islam have totally mastered what Revelation 2:15 calls "the doctrine of the Nicolaitanes"

— the conquering of the people (laity) by the priesthood. When this happens to the crazy degree that it has in fundamentalist Muslim areas, the people are so crushed and the priesthood are so uncontrollable that lives are lost, terrorism is undertaken, and everyone in the society is poorer for it.

The Tribulation Period is of little concern to today's Christians, truth to tell. We just won't be here for it. But we need to know it as part of End Times prophecy and a proper inspiration to witness. We see how the unbeliever is concerned in 1999 that the world is ending. Imagine how he's going to feel when the antiChrist is present, and everything is going to Hell in a handbasket!







Who Are the Elect of God?

Part 2

Divine election is based on predestination, which comes from a Greek word that means "to predetermine; to decree or decide beforehand." In His love, God determined to save sinners ahead of time — before creation (Eph. 1:4–5). God chose to redeem the elect through their faith in Jesus Christ (John 3:16; Rom. 10:9–10). Even with God's choice, election does not exclude a person's freedom to accept or reject Christ, for the Bible teaches both human responsibility and divine sovereignty.


God's sovereignty is His absolute authority and control (Isa. 46:9–10; Dan. 4:35; Eph. 1:11). This is clear throughout the process of salvation, from start to finish: "For those whom He foreknew He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, in order that He might be the Firstborn among many brothers. And those whom He predestined He also called, and those whom He called He also justified, and those whom He justified He also glorified" (Rom. 8:29–30).

God's elect includes Israel (Deut. 7:6; Ex. 19:4–6; Ps. 135:4; Isa. 41:8–9; 43:10; 44:1–2; 45:4; Amos 3:2; Rom. 11:1–3) and the Church (John 10:4–5; 1 Thess. 1:4–5; Eph. 1:4-14; 1 Pet. 1:1–2; 2:9; 5:13). Beyond these, God has elected and will elect others to be saved, serve Him, and accomplish His divine plan. In ancient times, the Lord chose men like Enoch, Noah, and Job to accomplish His plans. In the coming seven-year Tribulation Period, God will select and seal 144,000 male Jewish evangelists from the twelve tribes of Israel to witness to the world (Rev. 7:1–8). During that time, God will elect the Two Witnesses, whose work will start and end in Jerusalem, to reprove the world for their iniquities (Rev. 11:1–11).

God chose Jesus the Messiah to be His Elect One to bring salvation to Israel and the world, as prophesied in Isaiah 42:1 and fulfilled in Matthew 12:18. In the Church, God also elects people to serve Him through the Body of Christ (1 Cor. 12; 14; Eph. 4:11–16).

In Romans 11:33–36, Paul concluded his discussion of God's election of Israel — past, present, and future — by praising God for what He has done. Ultimately, the elect are chosen to glorify God for His sovereign decision (Eph. 1:12) and to elicit praise from those whom He chooses and redeems in this age and in the age to come, so that "He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus" (Eph. 2:7).

the free gift of Yeshua, whose very name means "salvation."





Not that I have one foot in the grave, but now I can rest in peace, knowing that this ministry will be in excellent hands whenever I give up the ghost or retire. Rapidly approaching age 65, I no longer fear the reaper — partly since the Rapture may beat him to the punch.

L7, formed in Los Angeles in 1985, is a girl (now old-woman) band known for its pandering, tough-broad demeanor and punk rock attitude. The band is living proof that "You'll never go broke by underestimating the taste of the masses." Their "music" is exactly the sort of sophomoric *dreck* that Zola abhorred. Even so, the group's incessantly repetitive hit song *Pretend We're Dead* inspired me to ponder a post-Mark ZLM.

Several decades ago, when Zola and I disagreed on a decision, he pointedly reminded me that this ministry prospered before I came aboard in 1988. Even when he was dying of metastasized lung cancer in March 2006, he quipped, "I still run this ministry until I'm gone!" Beyond that, stubborn warrior for the Lord that he was, he filmed studio segments of his Bible teaching that our producer inevitably deemed unusable since Zola was just too frail. Nonetheless, what proof of his devotion!

This past November marked my 36th ZLM-management anniversary; Zola's passing occurred after I served here for 18 years. In less than three years, I will be 67, the age at which Zola graduated to his Heavenly glory. Now he likely looks down with pride upon you donors and our staffers, including potentially the

best generation of ministerial leadership yet — and I'm talking about Josh, Caleb, and (if the Lord tarries another decade) my probable successor, Andrea Davis. She managed Berg Productions for 18 years before Ken Berg retired two months ago at age 81 and our ministry hired their key staffers. (See "The State of the Ministry" on p. 14 of the September 2024 Levitt Letter.)

Robert Baden-Powell (1857–1941), founder of the Boy Scouts, preferred to "lead from behind," which is what I'm increasingly doing with ZLM. The more I've done so, the more humbling it is to witness the excellence of:

- Josh and Caleb's multiple talents, boundless energy, and unceasing burden for the Lord's work. Oh, how those two Messianic Jews can pinch a TV production penny!
- Sarah Liberman's Personal Letters.
 Written by our Sabra living in
 northern Israel, these have become
 progressively more captivating.
 Wouldn't you agree?
- You with your endless prayers, moral support, and financial sustenance; thanks so much!

Incidentally, our unbelieving TV production vendors in Maine, who initially were skeptical and downcast about our new *Lobstermen* series, *all* insisted on donating their time and use of equipment!

The devil wants you to be afraid — very afraid — and inciting fear is the primary weapon that he uses against us. Our adversary understands that fear profoundly affects the way the human brain processes images and messages: Fear colors the way we see and hear things. And since the mind and body are intricately interconnected, fear is the root cause of many physiological problems like heart disease, high blood pressure, clinical depression, and other ailments. Left unchecked, fear can be deadly.

Most of our negative emotions come from fearful thoughts, including anger, frustration, and rage. On a spiritual level, fear and worry can cause people to question God's love, to doubt His promises, and so on. The devil knows that frightening people causes them to be unsettled, off-balance, and therefore vulnerable to all sorts of sickness, manipulation, and deception. Living in fear is a form of slavery (Heb. 2:15).

The war for truth began in the orchard of Eden when Satan lied to Eve by saying that she would not die if she disobeyed God (Gen. 3:4). Satan cunningly played on Eve's fear of being deceived as he

persuaded her to disobey. Fear, then, is the emotional center of sin and the opposite of faith. The fearful are referred to as the "unbelieving" and those who "love and make a lie" (Rev. 21:8; 22:15).



God repeatedly tells us not to be afraid — of man, war, tribulation, various plagues, or even of death itself (Rom. 8:35-39). Indeed, one of the most frequently occurring commandments in Scripture is simply al-tirah, "Be not afraid."

But how do we overcome our fear? How can we live our faith amidst a worldwide cultural slide into deception and insanity? How else but by wholeheartedly trusting that God is with us? The Lord will never leave nor forsake us, even if we face difficult circumstances. The antidote to fear is heartfelt faith in God's love for us (1 John 4:18). God saves us from our fears (Ps. 34:4; 2 Tim. 1:7; Heb. 2:15). When we trust that God personally cares for us, we find the courage to face life without fear. 🔯

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



Josiah and the Last Reformation book


The last days of the Kingdom of Judah relevantly parallel the Last Days in which we as Believers are living today.

Dr. Phil: Defending Israel "Just Duty to Me"

Phil McGraw — "Dr. Phil" — isn't Jewish. Nonetheless, the clinical psychologist and talk show host explained that his staunch support of Israel is "really not anything other than just duty to me. Everybody should be doing what I'm doing."

The well-known psychologist has often denounced Jew-hatred. He commented that he was "appalled at the silence from so many people," including colleagues and fellow broadcasters, "who should be speaking out about" it.

Dr. Phil never expected to hear the anti-Semitism and anti-Israel sentiments on U.S. college campuses, where students and professors "are encouraging or allowing this. They are absolutely supporting terrorist organizations," he noted, of those he termed "useful idiots." He asked, "How are people in the United States not standing up and calling this out more than they are?"

Growing up, Dr. Phil learned about a "very clear distinction between right and wrong," adding that "good and evil are not relative."

"There is no moral equivalence to what the Hamas invaders did, when they were killing infants in their cribs, versus a child who loses their life from a piece of shrapnel from above," he explained. "One is a war crime. The other is an act of war. There is no equivalence between the two.

"You can't come across a boundary and kill non-combatants, kill children in their cribs, kill elderly people that are

sleeping in their beds unarmed, then run back and hide behind children in schools and patients in hospitals," he added. "Those deaths, that blood is on the hands of the Hamas invaders."

Last year, Dr. Phil traveled to Israel, where he witnessed the aftermath of Hamas's atrocities. He recalled his conversation with a first responder from the Nova site: "He was there by himself for a long time, and he collected bodies and body parts and brought them to a central location. It changed me forever to hear this man — what he went through and what toll it took on him."

Asked about the difference between Gazans and Hamas, Dr. Phil asserted, "Sometimes, it may be a distinction without a difference," because of the involvement of "supposed civilians." He mentioned Israelis who hid during the atrocities while listening to Gazans "laughing, and ... going through everything and carrying things out of their homes."

Dr. Phil called the terrorists "monsters," who've been brainwashed. "They're teaching them that the Israelis are evil. They're programmed to kill them and brag about it from the time that they're old enough to be reasoned with," he said.

To those who call the Jewish state "apartheid," Dr. Phil countered, "I don't know of a country that is more accepting of different lifestyles, beliefs, countries, ethnicities than Israel."

You go, Dr. Phil! (I knew that I liked him!) He's speaking TRUTH! —Kirsten

Thoughts into Words: Artificial Speech for Paralyzed People

Israeli researchers have achieved a groundbreaking scientific breakthrough that can transform thoughts into words without using the mouth. This could enable people with paralysis from brain injuries, brainstem strokes, or amyotrophic lateral sclerosis

(ALS) to "speak" artificially, using only the power of thought.

The study was led by Dr. Ariel Tankus of Tel Aviv University and Dr. Ido Strauss of Tel Aviv Sourasky Medical Center.

During the experiment, a patient with depth electrodes implanted in his brain imagined saying one of two syllables. The electrodes transmitted the electrical signals to a computer, which then vocalized them.

"The 37-year-old patient in the study is an epilepsy patient who was hospitalized to undergo resection of the epileptic focus in his brain," Tankus noted. "He has intact speech and was implanted with depth electrodes for clinical reasons only."

Afterward, the patient was asked to articulate two syllables — "a" and "e" — out loud. Researchers recorded his brain activity while he spoke the syllables and then trained artificial intelligence models to identify the brain cells that indicated the desire to say "a" or "e" based on their electrical activity. As the computer learned to recognize the pattern of electrical activity in the patient's brain associated with the two syllables, researchers instructed him to imagine saying "a" and "e."



The electrical signals in his brain were then translated by the computer, which then played the pre-recorded sounds of the syllables.

"For the first time in history, we were able to connect the parts of speech to the activity of indi-

vidual cells from the regions of the brain from which we recorded. This allowed us to differentiate among the electrical signals that represent the sounds "a" and "e." At the moment, our research involves two building blocks of speech — two syllables. Our ambition is to get to complete speech, but even two different syllables can enable a fully paralyzed person to signal 'yes' and 'no," Tankus noted.



In the future, the researchers believe that it will be possible to translate thoughts into speech in the early stages of ALS, while a patient can still speak. The computer would learn to identify and interpret the electrical signals in the patient's brain and later express the patient's thoughts in artificial speech if the patient cannot speak.

Israeli Researchers Discover Mechanism to Destroy Tumors

Israeli researchers have discovered a way to stimulate the immune system to fight cancer cells, including those that were considered resistant to prevailing forms of immunotherapy. The "chance technological breakthrough" by researchers at Tel Aviv University (TAU) essentially reverses a mechanism in cancer patients that prevents the immune system from attacking tumors.

The academic lab that made the discovery studies both cancer and the effects of ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun on the skin and body, both of which can suppress the immune system.

"While in most cases, we cancer researchers worldwide focus on the tumor and look for mechanisms by which cancer inhibits the immune system, here we proposed a different approach: investigating how UV exposure suppresses the immune system and applying our findings to cancer," said TAU Prof. Carmit Levy, one of the study leaders.

"The discovery of a mechanism that inhibits the immune system opens new paths for innovative therapies," she added.

The researchers found that after exposure to UV radiation, the immune system's T cells — which play a critical role in fighting cancer — begin to

express high levels of the protein Ly6a, explained PhD student Avishai Maliah.

"We suspected that Ly6a serves as a brake through which UV inhibits the immune system, and that by releasing this brake, optimal activation of the immune system might be resumed," he added.

He treated cancer in the lab with Ly6a antibodies, which significantly reduced the tumors. Moreover, cancers resistant to known treatments reacted substantially to Ly6a antibodies.

"Immunotherapy has revolutionized the treatment of cancer," noted TAU Prof. Yaron Carmi, a global expert on the immune system and co-author of the study. "However, about 50% of the patients do not respond to the currently prevailing treatment."

The Israeli team is now working to translate their findings into a drug for cancer patients, hoping to offer an effective new treatment.



Weaponizing Wikipedia Against Israel

Wikipedia — the world's fifth-leading website with 100 billion visits annually — is no longer a bastion of objectivity. Research now reveals how a secret network of anti-Israel activists is engaged in a massive "edit war" to nefariously insert anti-Israel propaganda throughout Wikipedia.

Although Wikipedia professes a strict neutral point of view, its open editing model — allowing anyone to edit articles, often without a login — makes the system vulnerable to abuse.

Organized efforts such as "Tech for Palestine" and "Wikipedia Collaboration," likely funded by Iran, are currently conspiring to hijack Wikipedia. Working in small rotating groups to evade detection, these activists have made over 850,000 edits to Israel-related articles, demonizing Israel as a "colonial, apartheid, genocidal regime."

Slowly and incrementally, these "minor edits" — often one word or sentence at a time — cumulatively account for most of the content on key Wikipedia articles, distorting the narrative, and turning Wikipedia into a swamp of anti-Israel bias.

Systemic Bias

In thousands of Israel-related articles, Wikipedia's core value of "neutrality" is blatantly violated:

- The first sentence on Wikipedia's main Zionism page characterizes the Zionist movement not as the return of the Jewish people to their 3,800-year-old indigenous homeland, but as "the colonization of a land outside of Europe ... to create a Jewish state in Palestine with as much land, as many Jews, and as few Palestinian Arabs as possible."
- Wikipedia's main article on Hamas never mentions that Hamas's 1988 charter calls for jihad and the destruction of Israel.
- Wikipedia pages such as "Israeli Apartheid" turn spurious accusations into definitive facts. An article initially titled "Allegations of genocide in the 2023 Israeli attack on Gaza" is now titled definitively, "Gaza Genocide."
- Anti-Israel activists created a dedicated page comparing Israel to Nazi Germany, while erasing the actual Nazism in Palestinian society and downplaying the Palestinian Mufti's alliance with Hitler.
- Wikipedia cites Nadia Abu El Haj

 a fringe Columbia professor and staunch anti-Zionist — who questions whether Ashkenazi Zionists are Jewish: "The Ashkenazi Jew



is the most dubious Jew, the Jew whose historical and genealogical roots in ancient Palestine are most difficult to see and perhaps thus to believe"

The website's bias includes silencing mainstream pro-Israel voices. Wikipedia banned the Anti-Defamation League as an "unreliable source" on anything related to Israel, while rating anti-Israel sources like Al Jazeera and Amnesty International as "reliable."

Hijacking the System

Exposing this bias is crucial because Wikipedia is a key influencer of information pipelines:

- Wikipedia is the default result of routine info requests on Google, Alexa, Siri, etc.
- Students, educators, journalists, and policy-makers often rely on Wikipedia as the starting point for research.
- Wikipedia's billions of words are a key component of popular AI tools like ChatGPT.

This "unprotected back door" is insidiously exploited by activists who manipulate Wikipedia to spread anti-Israel views as "established fact." For example, Candace Owens supported an anti-Semitic claim that the Star of David is used in child sacrifice and black magic when she stated: "If it's on Wikipedia ... it's an irreversible fact."

More blatantly, activists have hijacked Wikipedia Arabic, where every page — over a million articles — displays the Wikipedia logo wrapped in the Palestinian flag. The top of every page also features a black banner proclaiming "solidarity with the rights of the Palestinian people" and promoting blood libels against the Jewish people: "No to genocide in Gaza ... no to killing civilians ... no to targeting hospitals and schools..."

Why It Matters

This struggle for the "digital narrative" is not merely a public relations contest. Misinformation about Israel translates into negative sentiments toward Jews

and a rise in anti-Semitism. Indeed, the Nazi genocide was made possible largely by their propaganda campaign to defame the Jews.

For Israel — the only country in the world whose right to exist is challenged — Wikipedia's bias exacerbates that existential threat. As Diana Buttu, former legal advisor to the PLO, remarked: The Israeli-Palestinian conflict is "a battle over language sometimes more than over anything else."

This insidious drip, drip, drip — via thousands and thousands of edits — is difficult to detect and even more difficult to reverse. Yet without taking action to combat it, the bias (and its ramifications) will get incrementally worse. AI models will grow in power and scope, and as long as Wikipedia maintains a reputation for objectivity, it will continue to forge the basic narrative.

What to Do About It

On Wikipedia, another drop of history is rewritten every moment. To help reverse this trend:

- Use Wikipedia only as a reference point for primary sources. Research the sources and reach your own logical conclusion.
- Consume information with a critical eye. Identify bias and filter it out.
- When you read something that sounds biased, compose your own version of the text in a more fair and balanced way. This is the difference between complaining and constructive criticism.
- If you see something amiss, share it. Make your voice heard. Freedom of information is guaranteed only to those who guard it.

By keeping this issue at the forefront, we put Wikipedia on notice that we won't assume its credibility and that information channels must not operate unchecked and unrestrained.

Otherwise, humanity could end up outmaneuvered and manipulated, victims of this *jihadi* media war.

Legendary boxer Floyd Mayweather returned to Israel in October 2024. Mohammad Ali Al-Husseini, a Lebanese Shi'ite Islamic scholar said in a September 2024 interview that all Shi'ite religious scholars agree that there is no religious value to Jerusalem or specifically to the Dome of the Rock.

Interviewer: "What does Palestine mean for Hezbollah?"

Mohammad Ali Al-Husseini: "The city of Jerusalem is a cultural, multi-religious, and historical city ... All the Shi'ite religious scholars and sources of authority, with no exception, say that there is no religious value to Jerusalem..."

"There is no hadith or quote from the descendants of the Prophet Muhammad about its virtue or status. Moreover, it has no special status in Islam ... This was a





political issue between Ibn Zubayr and Ibn Marwan ... Ibn Zubayr took over Mecca and the *Hajj* pilgrimage, so Ibn Marwan ... instated the *Hajj* and the circling of the Dome of the Rock. In any case, this has been exploited politically. So, there is

no mention, and no special status is given in the Shi'ite books ... I asked for a fatwa about this from the sources of authority. There is no Shi'ite religious significance to Jerusalem, and specifically to the Dome of the Rock."

Israel's Iron Beam Air-Defense Lasers

The Israeli Ministry of Defense recently announced that its Iron Beam systems will enhance the network of Israeli airdefense weapons sometime in 2025. The Iron Beam will operate alongside Iron Dome batteries, noted militaryresearch chief Daniel Gold. "The combination of laser interception and missile interception will further tighten the defense envelope against rockets, missiles, drones, cruise missiles, and other threats."

Two Israeli defense contractors are constructing the Iron Beam directed-energy weapon. Rafael is the primary developer of the system, while Elbit supplies the laser cannon for it.

Iron Beam is a laser air-defense system that operates against a variety of smaller airborne threats. It can be programmed to follow low-flying targets, zapping them with just enough energy to disable them. It proved its

capabilities in a series of tests in southern Israel about three years ago, after which it entered operational development and adaptation to the battlefield.

The price of a Tamir missile, which is the interceptor launched by Iron Dome, is about \$100,000. In contrast, the cost of interception using a laser shield is the price of the electricity used to launch it.

Laser interception should revolutionize the expense of air defense, which so far has favored attackers because missiles and drones are cheaper to deploy than to shoot down. Still, the laser system is more limited than Iron Dome in its ability to deal with large rocket barrages, along with limitations on days of impaired visibility because of clouds, rain, or sandstorms.

How Assyria's Military Campaign Impacted Judah

Assyria's siege of Jerusalem in 701 B.C. is mentioned in the Bible, in Assyrian records, and by ancient historians such as Herodotus. As part of unifying the empire under King Sennacherib, the Assyrians moved to quash rebellions by states in the region, including the Kingdom of Judah, which was ruled by King Hezekiah.

According to the Biblical account, the Assyrians ravaged the country surrounding Jerusalem and laid siege to the city. However, a plague disrupted Sennacherib's army, causing thousands of deaths among his troops. [Editor's note: Isaiah 37:36 specifies God's involvement in the destruction: "And the angel of the LORD went out and struck down 185,000 in the camp of the Assyrians. And when people arose early in the morning, behold, these were all dead bodies." The event is recorded in 2 Kings 18:13–19:36; 2 Chron. 32:1–22; and Isa. 36:1–37:37.]

Both the Bible and Assyrian records agree that the Assyrians didn't conquer Jerusalem. They returned home after Hezekiah agreed to continue to pay tribute to Assyria while maintaining nominal independence.

New discoveries by the Israel Antiquities Authority (IAA) reveal how the Assyrian campaign affected Jerusalem's economy and how Judean tributes were collected

Recent excavations in Mordot Arnona, a neighborhood in southern Jerusalem, unearthed two large buildings, one destroyed and the other built on its ruins. Archaeologists also found 180 ceramic jar handles engraved with Hebrew inscriptions that identified the owner of the contents.

"We discovered remains of a significant royal administrative center from the days of King Hezekiah, and perhaps even from the reign of his father, King Ahaz," the excavation directors noted. This center "was destroyed down to its

foundations and buried under a massive heap of stones. The stone pile formed a platform upon which a subsequent structure was erected ... Large building stones originating from the early structure were deliberately incorporated into the heap." Both of the monumental buildings stored agricultural products before they were sent to Jerusalem or elsewhere.

The archaeologists believe that with the destruction of the first building and the subsequent construction of the second, the Assyrians were making a statement about "who [was] really in charge."

Inscribed handles from large ceramic storage jars offer a clue about how the Assyrians reorganized this agricultural production. Researchers found a total of 180 handles, most of them stamped with the Hebrew letters *LMLK* — "(belonging) to the king." This inscribing was a common practice at the time, as the Kingdom of Judah collected and controlled the agricultural products that farmers used to pay taxes.


However, 17 of the handles were inscribed with individual names including Menachem Yubna, Peqach Tavra, and Tzophen Azaryahu. These handles were only found in the early building that the Assyrians destroyed. The archaeologists explained that these "private stamp impressions" were probably part of King Hezekiah's preparations "to rebel against Assyria, at which time taxation to the Assyrian Empire ceased."

After the rebellion, the private impressions disappeared and the jug handle impressions "differ from the earlier types and mark the return of Assyrian taxation," they added.

"The amount of these handles and the names are important," noted Natan Ben-Ari, one of the excavation directors. "It seems that they were government officials or administrators in senior positions" who were receiving some of

the agricultural production — likely olive oil or wine — which was then diverted to the Assyrians after the invasion."

The jug handles are on display at the Jay and Jeanie Schottenstein National Campus for the Archaeology of Israel, the IAA's newly opened headquarters in Jerusalem. \$\square\$

An Anti-Semitic Tsunami Explodes Across Europe

Outside the Brussels Stock Exchange, on the one-year anniversary of Hamas's atrocities on October 7, 2023, pro-Hamas demonstrators joined in a public prayer for Allah "to burn the Jews."

Since the terror attacks on October 7, 2023, pro-Hamas, anti-Israel demonstrations — which feature the chant "From the river to the sea" — have been a daily occurrence in Brussels. Even the leaders of Belgium's major left-wing political parties have joined some of those demonstrations.

Though the European Union has designated Hamas a terrorist group, Hamas-affiliated organizations are operating in several countries.

Joël Rubinfeld, president of the Belgian League Against Anti-Semitism, commented that Brussels today feels like Gaza, and Jews in Belgium and across Europe are asking if it's time to leave. "It's just crazy," he noted. "It's a tsunami of anti-Semitism that is spreading all over the Western world. Just the fact that Jews say that they think about leaving their country because they are not safe anymore as a Jew is a failure of the democracy. It's a failure of Belgium."

Both France and Germany reported that the number of anti-Semitic crimes doubled in 2024 compared to 2023.

In Britain, the number of reported anti-Semitic incidents has more than doubled. And in a nation that has been a safe haven for Jews, some have raised

the specter of 1930s Germany. While comparisons to Nazi Germany are overused, there are some disturbing parallels for British Jews. Because of threats, some Jewish organizations now have secret addresses. Virtually all need security.

Gideon Falter, Chief Executive of Britain's Campaign Against Anti-Semitism, remarked, "We are seeing the radicalization of society. We are seeing young people who believe that they are doing a righteous thing by discriminating. We see graffiti. We're hearing from Holocaust survivors who say, you've got to be really careful about this stuff."

British Journalist David Collier, a Jew, doesn't believe that the situation for Britain's Jewish citizens will improve because of how the influx of Muslim immigrants has changed perceptions of Israel and Jews. In describing today's Britain, Collier commented: "It's a different country with a different demographic, a different outlook. Everything about it is different."

In Belgium, Rubinfeld added that it feels as if European Jews live in "a kind of parallel world" where Israel, Jews, and democracy are evil, and Hamas is good. "It's what I call the 'anti-Semitic metaverse' — where black is white and wrong is right. It is an inversion of values, an inversion of truth."

Collier is afraid that Europe will never again be a safe place for Jews. "I see Europe as 'lost.' I just don't see a way back."




