

Dismantle the United Nations

After the International Criminal Court (ICC) issued arrest warrants for Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and his former defense minister, Yoav Gallant — on the basis of malevolent falsehoods and serial abuses of its own processes — outraged people said that it was time for the ICC to be defunded and dismantled.

After the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA) was revealed as working directly with Hamas — with UNRWA teachers and others moonlighting as Hamas terrorists and almost every UNRWA school or hospital doubling as a weapons dump or terrorist hub — people said that the UNRWA should be defunded and dismantled.

After the International Court of Justice (ICJ) falsely accused Israel of illegally occupying the disputed territories of Judea and Samaria — having previously given serious consideration to

Anti-Semitism Affects 64% of U.S. Jewish Women By Zev Stub TimesOflsrael.com

Nearly two-thirds of U.S. Jewish women say that they are impacted by anti-Semitism in their everyday lives, according to a December 2024

report by Hadassah, The Women's Zionist Organization of America.

The report — based on a survey of 1,000 Jewish women in the

Pro-Palestinian demonstrators on the campus of Columbia University, October 7, 2024.

U.S. — found that 64% of women said anti-Semitism impacted their life, work, or relationships. In addition, 62% noted that they felt physically or psychologically unsafe.

The survey also found that 52% felt the need to hide their Jewish identity, 33% experienced hate speech, and 22% were excluded from groups or events because of their Jewish or Zionist identity.

"Now we know the heartbreaking truth [about anti-Semitism in America]," observed Hadassah National President Carol Ann Schwartz. "Every day, Jewish women are suffering in silence, isolation, and fear as they live in the shadows of hate."

Since Hamas terrorists attacked Israel on October 7, 2023 — killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and taking 251 hostages — the threat of anti-Semitism in public schools in the U.S. has increased, leading many parents to enroll their children in Jewish day schools, the report said. Meanwhile, security costs for Jewish institutions have surged by an average of more than 50%.

The report shared stories of Jewish women being harassed, assaulted, isolated, and excluded by peers.

"I was physically attacked at a rally and my Israeli flag was stolen and burnt in front of me," one woman noted.

Another respondent commented: "Earlier [in 2024], our house was egged on both the front and the side because we had a small flag in the front that said, 'We Support Israel.'"

"Both of my kids faced anti-Semitism at school. One had pennies thrown at him and was told to go back to the ovens," another woman added

One vigilant respondent explained: "When I go to shul (synagogue), I don't sit by the door. I sit away from it and have a plan of escape."

The report concluded with stories of women who confronted hatred with resilience. "My initial reaction was to be afraid and hide, but I thought about my relatives who were killed in the Holocaust and it empowered me to become a fighter instead," stated one woman. "I'm still afraid, but I proudly wear my [Jewish] star, have Israeli and American flags in front of my house, and have a blue porch light on at night to show my support of Israel."

Jewish communities in the U.S. and around the world have seen a surge in anti-Semitic incidents since the Hamas onslaught and subsequent war in Gaza.

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

a grotesque claim that Israel was committing genocide by defending itself against genocide — people said that the ICJ was a travesty that systematically misused the law to delegitimize and destroy Israel.

When will people connect the dots? It's not just these bodies that have been corrupted and need to be dismantled. The whole panoply of international law and "human rights" has become an onslaught against truth and justice, knocking the world off its moral compass.

At the center of this vortex of corruption is the United Nations (UN).

Blatant Bias

Established after World War II as the global custodian of peace and justice, the UN has systematically betrayed that aim by its obsessional malice against Israel. It continually singles out the only democracy in the Middle East for wildly disproportionate and wholly unfounded denunciation as the world's worst abuser of human rights, while disregarding authenticated abuses by its tyrannical member states.

Accusations against Israel of genocide, apartheid, and crimes against humanity bounce around the UN, the ICJ, the ICC, and non-governmental organizations such as Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch. They feed these claims into each other's reports, and then repeat and recycle them to create an infernal echo chamber of Israel demonization.

The claim of genocide is as ludicrous as it is grotesque. Genocide is the intentional annihilation of a people. That's the avowed goal of Iran, Hamas, and Hezbollah in their planned eradication of Israel and the killing of every Jew.

In defending itself against this plan of mass slaughter, Israel has gone to unprecedented lengths to protect Gazan civilians by repeatedly moving them out of harm's way, allowing in thousands of tons of humanitarian aid, and enabling the Gazan

population to increase over the course of the war by more than 2%.

Ignoring Reality

Despite these demonstrable facts, the UN makes feverish attempts to accuse Israel of the crimes that are actually committed against the Jewish state.



The UN report repeated the blood libel that Israeli forces had caused unprecedented levels of killings, death, injury, starvation, and disease. Referencing the ICJ's ruling, the UN demanded that Israel fully and immediately protect against and punish acts of genocide, which it has clearly never committed.

Later, the UN Special Committee to Investigate Israeli Practices (whose very title reveals an extreme level of prejudice) announced that it had found "serious concerns of breaches of international humanitarian and human rights laws" and "the possibility of genocide in Gaza and an apartheid system in the West Bank."

The UN hammers home the message that Israel's just war of defense against genocide is genocide. This demonizes Israel while giving true genocidists a free



pass. Moreover, it elevates and honors them: Iran, the terrorist state that flouts the nonproliferation treaty in its race to develop nuclear weapons, preposterously chaired the UN Conference on Disarmament last year.

In November 2024, the UN did not renew the contract of Alice Wairimu Nderitu of Kenya, the Special Adviser on the Prevention of Genocide, because she firmly maintained that Israel's war with Hamas is not genocide. Though she gave the world body a lesson in what genocide actually is, that was not what it wanted to hear.

An Appalling Objective

The UN is consumed by efforts to delegitimize Israel for no other reason than wanting the Jewish state to disappear because so many member states want this. To service this apparatus of demonization, it has employed legions of Israel-bashers and Jew-haters.

Its three-member commission of inquiry into Israel's presumed crimes, which was set up uniquely to exist in perpetuity, is headed by Navi Pillay who has previously called for sanctions against "apartheid Israel." Miloon Kothari, the second commissioner, has ranted about "the Jewish lobby." The third member, Chris Sidoti, has sneered that "accusations of anti-Semitism are thrown around like rice at a wedding."

The UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, Volker Türk, has repeatedly accused Israel of committing crimes of which it is not only innocent but have been committed against Israel by Hamas. These include hostage-taking, using civilians as human shields, and sexual assault.

Francesca Albanese is the UN Human Rights Council's "Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in the Palestinian territories occupied since 1967." She has repeatedly equated Palestinian suffering with the Holocaust, falsely accused Israel of war crimes and genocide, and, in 2019, wrote that America was "subjugated by the Jewish lobby." In 2023, she told Hamas: "You have a right to resist."

Albanese has been condemned by France and Germany for anti-Semitism. The U.S.

State Department has said that it "firmly concludes that she is unfit for her role or any role in the United Nations ... we will continue to stand against anti-Semitism."

Except, of course, the U.S. doesn't. [This article was written in November 2024 and refers to U.S. policies during the Biden administration.] Standing against anti-Semitism means dismantling the UN. Instead, they continue funding and dealing with it as if its malice against Israel doesn't exist. The nations of the so-called civilized world behave as if the world body really does what it was created to do.

Though the UN was established to bring the world together to promote peace and justice, most countries aren't democracies and don't uphold human rights. It's no surprise, then, that the UN doesn't uphold peace and justice but instead promotes the opposite.

A Pervasive Influence

The UN's institutionalized malice against Israel has spread evil far beyond the Middle East.

The lies and distortions about Israel regurgitated by the UN and its satellite institutions and NGOs, along with the courts dispensing international "human rights" law, are treated as unchallengeable truths by the West because this whole "humanitarian" infrastructure is treated as a veritable religion of peace and justice.

Instead, it's an unstoppable geyser of moral and intellectual corruption. In teaching the West that lies about Israel are truths and truths are lies, it has turned what the West tells itself is morality and conscience into an agenda of evil.

This ensures that the West can no longer distinguish more generally between victim and oppressor, reality and propaganda, right and wrong.

The UN should be dismantled. It's the pivot of the apparatus that has twisted the Western mind. Treating it and international law as the moral arbiters of the global order is not just a sick joke. It has made the world sick, too.



It is true that the West was formed by Athens and Jerusalem — meaning the rational thinking introduced by Greece and the moral and religious thought introduced by Israel.

Of the two, Jerusalem's contribution was the more enduring. Relatively few Westerners read Aristotle and Plato. Virtually every citizen of the West — until the last generation or two — was familiar with the Bible. Europe was Westernized by the Catholic Church in the name of the Bible, not Homer.

Were it not for the Jews and their Bible, there would be no Christianity — and therefore no Western civilization. The abolition of slavery was led by Biblebelieving Christians. The Bible, not Aristotle, was their moral inspiration.

Regarding America, its Founders, even the less religious ones, were rooted in Biblical morality. Two of the least religious — Thomas Jefferson and Benjamin Franklin — designed a Great Seal of the United States that depicted the Jews leaving Egypt. The only inscription on the symbol of American Liberty, the Liberty Bell, is a verse from the Torah (the first five books of the Bible). The insignia of Yale Univer-

sity is in Hebrew, and it, too, is taken from the Torah. The Princeton University seal features an open Bible. Until about 1800, students at Yale, Harvard, and other universities were required to study Hebrew.

To Index

Many American Founders described America as a "Second Israel." In the words of Eran Shalev, a Fulbright scholar who became a professor of history at Haifa University:

So prevalent was the Old Testament in the early culture of the United States that for decades after the start of the nineteenth century it was, in the words of Perry Miller (a Harvard professor regarded as the cofounder of the field of American studies) as "omnipresent ... as ... the air that people breathed."

The American Founders' attitude toward the Jews is summed up in these words of John Adams, second president of the United States:

I will insist [that] the Hebrews have (contributed) more to civilize men than any other nation. If I was an atheist and believed in blind eternal fate, I should still believe that fate had ordained the Jews to be the most

essential instrument for civilizing the nations. ... The Romans and their empire were but a bubble in comparison to the Jews. They have given religion to three-quarters of the globe and have influenced the affairs of mankind more, and more happily, than any other nation, ancient or modern.

As Israel once made the West, now it is saving the West. Recently, this was eloquently stated by Gerard Baker in a Wall Street Journal column titled, "Israel Defends Itself — and May Save Western Civilization":

How will we ever repay the debt we owe Israel? What the Jewish state has done in the past year — for its own defense, but in the process and not coincidentally for the security

of all of us — will rank among the most important contributions to the defense of Western civilization in the past three-quarters of a century.

Israel has in 12 months done nothing less than redraw the balance of global security, not just in the region, but in the wider world. It has eliminated thousands of the terrorists whose commitment to a savage theocratic ideology has claimed so many lives across the region and the world for decades.

Above all, it has provided an unexpected but crucial reminder to our enemies that there are at least some willing and able to pursue and defeat them, whatever the risk to our own lives and resources. The only appropriate responses to Israel's gallantry, fortitude, and skill from us — its nominal allies, especially in the U.S. — are "thank you" and "how can we help?"

"Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so

few," Winston Churchill said of the men of the Royal Air Force after they had repelled Hitler's Luftwaffe during the Battle of Britain

We should echo those words today as we watch in awe what a country smaller in area than New Jersey, with a population less than North Carolina's and an economy smaller than that of Washington state, has done for all of us.

Baker is not alone in understanding that Israel's war is a war for the West. On the first anniversary of the Hamas atrocities in southern Israel, Brendan O'Neill, former editor of the British libertarian magazine *Spiked*, wrote:

The West's moral failures in the aftermath of October 7 were of an entirely new order. They exceeded even my grim fears. They shone a harsh, inescapable light on the retreat from reason and abandonment of Enlightenment that many of us have warned of for years. ... The delirium of our post-civilizational era emerged into broad daylight. It was undeniable now: The West is in the stranglehold of a profound moral crisis. ... The sympathy for Hamas on our campuses and streets is fundamentally an extension of the West's own crisis of meaning, of our denial of our own insights, of our betrayal of our history.

A war for the soul of humanity must now be fought. On two fronts. On the physical front of Israel's borders ... [and] on the intellectual front here at home. ... Only a full-throated defense of the virtues and wonders of Western civilization might see off the moral derangement of our times and the Jew hatred it has nurtured.

If you care about Western civilization, you need to care about ancient Israel and Israel today. 🌣




"Out of sight, out of mind." If you don't live in the Land of Israel, it may be hard to remember that Israelis have been at war since October 7, 2023. Occasionally, however,

Does it really matter what we believe about dispensations, End Times prophecy, Israel, and so forth? Is it really important that we have one or another kind of understanding on each of these matters?

On the subject of dispensations, I think it certainly does. A dispensation is a kind of spiritual organizing principle presented to man by God. The dispensations in the Bible follow in very orderly fashion. To rightly divide the Word of God, we simply need to understand these changing spiritual economies and their progression from the Garden of Eden to eternity. Since there are dispensations in the Bible, and since they progress, I suppose that's where the term "progressive dispensationalism" came from. Even so, the doctrine is full of error, as we have shown. Its results are disastrous. Borrowing a term like dispensationalism to form some convenient, new Scriptural doctrine is a very bad thing when it gets the kind of results we are seeing.

As to our understanding of End Times prophecy, it is everything to the believing Christian. After all, if it is possible

that we may be Raptured tonight, then that is something very important to know. And if, on the contrary, the Church is going to go through the entire Tribulation period with all of its judgments and calamities, then that's important to know, too. After nearly 30 years of intensive Bible study and consultation with expert theologians, I firmly believe in the Pre-Tribulation Rapture, which is to say that the Rapture is imminent and, in any case, will occur before the coming Tribulation period. That makes me actually live my life in a different way and look at the world in a different way.

During this past year, we had a very down-to-earth example of how our understanding of prophecy affects our behavior. Most of the people who held to views of the Church going through the Tribulation period expected throughout 1999 that the problem called Y2K would be the beginning of the end. While all prophecy teachers had some responsibility to discuss that subject (and this ministry did so), those who feared impending disaster really trumpeted the problem. Dr. Gary North was one who

taught that Y2K was to be a judgment of God on the whole world. On his website. he wrote:

The Y2K crisis is systemic. It cannot possibly be fixed. I think it will wipe out every national government in the West. Not just modify them destroy them. I honestly think the Federal government will go under. I think the U.S.A. will break up the way the U.S.S.R. did. Call me a dreamer. Call me an optimist. That's what I think. This will decentralize the social order. That is what I have wanted all. my adult life. In my view, Y2K is our deliverance. Just don't be in a city when deliverance occurs.

Dr. Thomas Ice. vice-chairman of the Pre-Trib Research Center and a commentator on our TV program in the past, placed the fault very skillfully on Dr. North's odd views of End Times prophecy:

I pointed out that Dr. North's theological views of postmillennial preterism [the idea that there will be no Kingdom and all End Times prophecy was fulfilled in the past] greatly impacted his analysis of the Y2K computer problem. Since he was looking for the collapse of America and Western civilization, he has grasped at every potential crisis and proclaimed each

event as a judgment of God. Who would be foolish enough to continue following his advice?

I noted many of his past failures even before his Y2K fiasco. It makes a difference what you believe the Bible teaches. It makes a difference what you believe or don't believe the Bible teaches about Bible prophecy. Dr. North's postmillennial preterism is not only unbiblical, it cannot stand the test of practical significance. However, the beliefs of those of us who take Bible prophecy literally are coming into focus with each passing day.

Gary North, and others like him, make fun of those of us who are looking for the Lord's return at any moment. This is what the New Testament teaches. We are looking for a person, whom we love, to return and take us to be with Himself, not for the collapse of Western civilization. That will come one day during the future seven-year Tribulation period. Until our Lord returns, we are to be found faithfully preaching the Gospel throughout the world and discipling converts in the Word of God



Even the well-known Pat Robertson sponsored conferences during the year in which post-Tribulationists panicked listeners, confused these warnings with the Word of God, sold an enormous amount of expensive survival supplies, and held prayer vigils and the like. 🌣

Ask the Chaplain

What is the Church?

Part 1

The Greek word *ekklesia* means "a calledout assembly." Our English word *ecclesiastical* ("pertaining to the church") comes from the same Greek word, which occurs over 100 times in the New Testament and is usually translated "Church." Even so, Stephen used *ekklesia* to refer to Israel as "the congregation in the wilderness" (Acts 7:38) during his defense before the Sanhedrin.

According to Vine's Expository Dictionary, the New Testament uses ekklesia in two ways. The first usage is the broadest, referring to "the whole company of the redeemed throughout the present era." When Jesus asserted, "I will build My Church" (Matt. 16:18), He spoke of a universal assembly. Paul emphasized this collective sense when he referred to the Church as Christ's "Body" in which Jesus is the Head (Eph. 5:23; Col. 1:18). This understanding of the Church includes all of the called-out Believers in Jesus Christ — both Jews and gentiles. The Church was born on the day of Pentecost and will continue until the Rapture, which will conclude the Church Age.

Vine's also notes the second New Testament usage of *ekklesia* as "a company consisting of professed Believers." This could include a specific Church (Matt.


18:17) or a group of local Churches in a region (Gal. 1:2).

Biblically speaking, the Church is not a building. Paul highlighted this in Romans 16:5 — "Greet the Church that is in their house" — where he referred to the group of Believers who met where Priscilla and Aquila lived. Rather than a physical structure, the Church is a spiritual temple comprised of all those who have placed their trust in Jesus Christ for salvation.

Jesus Christ is the founder and builder of the Church (Matt. 16:18). Using building imagery, the Apostles declared that Jesus is not only the Cornerstone (Eph. 2:20; 1 Pet. 2:6) but also the foundation upon which the Church is built: "For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 3:11). Continuing the word pictures, Peter emphasized that Jesus Christ is a "living Stone" and that those who believe in Him are also living stones, being built up as a spiritual house (1 Pet. 2:4–6), which is the Church.



In Part 2, we will look at the function of the Church and the difference between the visible and invisible Church.

believe in Jesus for the remission of sins (Acts 13:38) and receive salvation (2 Tim. 3:15).


Later, we visited the first-century ruins in Capernaum, along the northwest shore of the Sea of Galilee.

We must ready our hearts for the time of the Lord's coming, for the hour draws near. Yeshua lamented over Israel:

"You did not recognize the time of your visitation..." (Luke 19:44). But how was it possible for otherwise devoutly religious people to miss the advent of the Messiah, except that they disregarded the signs meant to awaken them? "So also, when you see all these things, you know that He is near, at the very gates" (Matt. 24:33). That's part of the meaning of teshuvah as well: "Repent and believe the message of life" (see Heb. 3:7–4:11). Esau "repented" with tears, but his wasn't true repentance since he did not turn his heart to embrace the truth of God's love.

True repentance always leads to healing and life. When the woman from Magdala wept and washed Yeshua's feet with her

tears, He said to those present, "I tell you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven—for she loved much" (Luke 7:44-48). In other words, she was lavish in her love because she deeply regretted that she had missed what was most important, what she desperately needed all along. She realized her sin as blindness to God's love. After all, why would she weep over her sins unless she loved Yeshua? And how could she love Him unless He first revealed His love to her? (1 John 4:19)







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British Evangelist Slashed, Jailed, Threatened, but Keeps Going

Hatun Tash was arrested in London's Hyde Park in June 2022. Metropolitan Police later had to pay her over \$12,000 in damages and costs for her wrongful arrest.

Hatun Tash

An ex-Muslim turned Christian has been beaten, chased by angry mobs, unlawfully jailed, and even stabbed, all for the sake of the Gospel. Hatun Tash, who grew up in Turkey as a Muslim, became a Christian after moving to England. But speaking against Islam in England made her a target. Thus, she has moved more than 50 times in the past four years because Muslims are trying to kill her. One man was sentenced to 24 years in prison for trying.

Her conversion to Christ began when she learned the truth about her religion. "As I read [Muhammad's] biography, it was very disturbing to me. So, the man you grew up to love and honor suddenly turns out to be ... not good. And I decided, I can't be Muslim."

Then she learned about a very different God. Tash declared that He "is not silent or far or distant from you ... He is a God who loves you, who pours out Himself on you. ... He puts Himself on the Cross and then says, 'I love you from everlasting to everlasting. Come to Me."

Tash began sharing this message with Muslims at London's Hyde Park. This has sometimes enraged them, such as three years ago when a man slashed her with a knife. He hasn't been caught.

She, however, has been arrested unlawfully. The London Police have twice

paid her damages for wrongful arrests, including in 2022 when they marched her through Hyde Park, then later stripsearched and jailed her.


This hasn't stopped Tash from sharing the Gospel. "I would simply stand in front of the mosques, and I'd say 'Muhammad is a false prophet. Jesus Christ is the Son of God. Tell me, what are your objections?' Hundreds of Muslims just stop and want to talk to you. Sometimes you get harmed; sometimes it gets dangerous. Sometimes you end up in hospitals; sometimes you end up in people's homes for a cup of tea," Tash remarked.

"I don't care whether people reject me or not. They need to hear the Gospel," she asserted.

A Christian legal group that has defended Tash stressed: "She is feared by and targeted by Muslim groups because she is fearless for the Gospel. She loves Jesus so much that nothing will halt her."

Tash will continue preaching and challenging Islam. "Things are dangerous. Should I choose to stay silent? ... The Gospel is so glorious; I cannot be silent. And the Lord is the giver of life. So, when it's my time, He will take me home. But as long as He gives me breath, we continue to preach."







Bathroom Breaks?


From C.H.: I was wondering if the Bible says anything regarding what happens after we're caught up in the Heavens. What if we have to go to the bathroom?

Zion Forever DVD Set Nine 30-minute programs on 2 DVDs

This nine-part series looks back at Israel's history and forward into prophecy while remembering the present status of the Temple Mount, the most contested real estate on Earth. Throughout the series, we hear from Eitan Shishkoff, archaeologists Eli Shukron, Dan Bahat, and Shimon Gibson, tour guide Hannah Ben Haim, and Israel expert Shahar Shilo. Zola Levitt's music complements the narrative and scenes of Israel.

The Place The Holy of Holies stood on a foundation stone called in Hebrew *HaMakom* (The Place). In exploring the ancient City of David, we hear from knowledgeable archaeologists and tour quides.

Western Wall The Western Wall is the closest that Jewish people can get to the site of the Holy of Holies. We see a Bar Mitzvah celebration at the Wall and hear how King David purchased the threshing floor atop Mount Zion.

Southern Steps Myles and Katharine Weiss walk along the southern edge of the Temple Mount where Messiah and other worshipers would have entered.



Kidron Valley From the Kidron Valley, which lies between the Temple Mount and the Mount of Olives, we hear the history of Jerusalem. Messiah will enter through the Golden Gate when He comes again.

Valley of Elah Young shepherd boy David slew the giant Goliath here. We discuss the walls of ancient Jerusalem, the Gihon Spring where David's forces invaded the city, and the tunnels at the southern end — possibly the final resting place for Judean kings.



Ein Gedi David hid from King Saul in a cave near the spring at Ein Gedi. We hear about the discovery of the Pool of Siloam and that the current King of Israel is Yeshua Himself.

Temple Mount The Temple Mount is the earthly center of spiritual warfare. We see thousands of artifacts from Bible times that have been discovered in the debris discarded over a decade ago from unauthorized Muslim excavations. Guest archaeologist Zachi Dvira was the first to note the importance of the debris.

Mount of Olives From the Mount of Olives, we look to the future of the Temple Mount. Archaeological finds continue to surface on Mount Zion, confirming Jewish heritage as recorded in the Bible.

In the Meantime The Dome of the Rock and Al-Aqsa Mosque currently sit atop the Temple Mount. A representative of Jerusalem Islamic Waqf, which governs the area, gives us the Muslim perspective. Guests: David Parsons of the International Christian Embassy Jerusalem, Itamar Marcus of Palestinian Media Watch, and a Jewish woman who is raising her family in the City of David.

Science in Israel

An Al-Powered Ally for Parents of ADHD Kids







The app uses short interactions and simple instructions.

Ziv Elul was 48 years old when he was diagnosed with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). He wasn't surprised, however. As a child he'd always been easily distracted and found it hard to focus.

In those days, teachers didn't recognize what we now regard as key indicators of the disorder. (The term ADHD wasn't officially recognized by the American Psychological Association until 1987.) Thus, Elul was left to devise his own coping strategies, with help from his parents.

Today ADHD is widely recognized — and widely medicated. Around 10% of U.S. children aged 3 to 17 have been diagnosed with the disorder. Children with ADHD typically struggle to pay attention, become restless and fidgety, behave impulsively, lose things, forget things, and fall out with other kids. Often, they are considered difficult or disruptive.


"A lot of parents feel alone," Elul noted.
"ADHD is complex, and they find it hard
to treat, hard to manage." Until recently,
there hasn't been a support system in
place to help parents understand ADHD
and get the best help for their kids. As
such, Elul thought about creating a
partially automated platform to train
parents, based on their shared experiences and the insights of professionals.

AI helps with training

The emergence of artificial intelligence (AI) fundamentally changed Elul's

approach. In 2022 he founded the Tel Aviv-based startup Pery, from the Hebrew word for "my treasure."

Pery is a 24/7 companion and advocate for parents of children with ADHD. It draws on a vast database of expert information to answer questions and offer suggestions. The system's AI has been trained by specialists in neurological, psychological, and behavioral care, together with over 4,000 books and research papers.



Pery provides personalized, sciencebacked answers via a smartphone or other device.

Short, clear, and specific

The Pery experience starts with an AI-driven intake interview to learn about the child. "The questions are all short, clear, and specific to you," says Elul. "It's not a questionnaire. We want to know what you really need from us now, and we prioritize."

Drawing on over 2,000 strategies for day-to-day life, Pery then develops a personalized plan for each child, together with suggestions for a daily routine. It asks parents for feedback at the end

of every day and will tweak its advice based on their responses.

There's plenty of advice available such as keeping instructions brief and clear, saying the child's name when giving important information, and more — but Pery tailors its guidance individually.

Pery also helps with the necessary paperwork for schools. In the U.S., schools require a "504 plan" to make provision for ADHD pupils, such as extra time in tests or more frequent breaks.

As full a picture as possible

"We aim to be the platform of choice from prediagnostic, from the age of five, until college," commented Elul.

Many parents will turn to Pery every day for practical tips, or to log side effects from ADHD medication, allowing the AI to build up as full a picture as possible and make recommendations accordingly.

All the company's staff of 16 understand ADHD because either they have it or a family member has it.

If Pery didn't exist, parents "could try ChatGPT, but what they would get is

very general knowledge and it won't be personalized," Elul explained.

"We also want to help parents with the relationships they have with clinicians, and we want to provide schools with more accurate data. We help with the self-esteem of the kids and that reduces the stress levels of the parents."

As a father of three kids diagnosed with ADHD (there's a genetic link), Elul also uses Pery. "Even for day-to-day basic things it has changed the way I look at things. I was not aware, for example, that if a kid doesn't want to take medication you can use a patch instead."

Elul highlighted another telling example of Pery's benefits. "You can tell Pery that you have a meeting tomorrow with your wife who is against medication. Then ask the app: What should I tell her?" This could make for an interesting discussion — especially if the wife asks Pery what she should tell her husband.

Pery is currently available in the U.S. and Israel. In the near future it will expand to other English-speaking countries. 🌣



Netanyahu Did More to Fight Terror in a Year than Europe has in 70 Years JNS.org

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has done more to fight terrorism than Europe has done "in the last 70 years," Geert Wilders declared while visiting Israel in December. The Dutch right-wing leader, whose Freedom Party leads the Netherlands' ruling coalition, addressed his remarks to Netanyahu at the first official meeting between the two at the Prime Minister's Office in Jerusalem.

In a post on X, Wilders credited his "friend" Netanyahu with "crushing Hamas, pulverizing Hezbollah, and significantly weakening Iran."

Wilders also met with Israeli President Isaac Herzog, Defense Minister Israel Katz, Foreign Minister Gideon Sa'ar, Energy Minister Eli Cohen, Knesset Speaker Amir Ohana, and other lawmakers.

Herzog told Wilders, "We greatly appreciate your unwavering solidarity with the Israeli people as we continue to work to free our hostages and to fight against the evil of terrorism in our region."

Welcoming the Dutch politician in the plenary hall of the Knesset, Ohana stated: "I would like to welcome my dear friend, leader of the Netherlands' Freedom Party, Geert Wilders, joining us today on yet another solidarity visit to Israel"

"Wilders' support for Israel and the Jewish people has been nothing short of historic," Ohana asserted. "In his own words, If Jerusalem falls, Athens and Rome, Paris, London, and Washington will be next. We are here to make sure Jerusalem shall forever stand," concluded the speaker, followed by a long applause from lawmakers across the political spectrum.

Before his meetings in Jerusalem, Wilders visited Samaria. Yossi Dagan, head of the Samaria Regional Council, told the visiting leader: "There are only 44 miles from the Mediterranean Sea to the Jordan River, with the hills of Samaria dominating the area, accounting for 34 [of those 44] miles." Wilders acknowledged that this is "very small,"

adding, "Not everyone will understand this, but I do."

Wilders declared that he was "proud and privileged" to return to Israel after more than seven years, "meet their leaders and politicians, and visit beautiful Judea and Samaria, where I used to live for some time in the 80s."

Wilders is a staunch supporter of Israel's right to all of the Land — from the Jordan River to the Mediterranean Sea. He lived in the Jewish State for two years during his youth and has reportedly visited the country more than 40 times. After graduating from secondary school, he volunteered for a year at Moshav Tomer in the Jordan Valley.

In November, Wilders said that he would be pursuing police action after the plans for his trip were leaked to the media, allegedly by Dutch civil servants, which reportedly led to the postponement of his visit. Wilders has lived under strict 24/7 police protection since 2004, after receiving death threats over his criticism of Islamic terrorists and extremists.

The Dutch newspaper *NRC* claimed that the meeting between Wilders and Dagan would run counter to the policies of Dutch Foreign Minister Caspar Veldkamp, who supports the creation of a Palestinian state in Judea, Samaria, and Gaza.

Veldkamp was scheduled to fly to Jerusalem for an official visit in November, but Sa'ar canceled it due to the Dutch diplomat's support for the International Criminal Court arrest warrants against Netanyahu and former Defense Minister Yoav Gallant.

Thessaloniki Holocaust Museum to Honor Jewish Heritage

The city of Thessaloniki, Greece, has begun construction of the Holocaust Museum of Greece, which will memorialize the city's rich Jewish history and the tragic losses suffered during World War II. Slated to open in 2026, the long-awaited museum is being built on the site of the Old Railway Station, where the first Nazi train carrying Jews to Auschwitz departed on March 15, 1943.

Once known as the "Jerusalem of the Balkans," Thessaloniki was home to a thriving Jewish community for over 2,300 years. By the early 20th century, it was Europe's only major city with a Jewish majority. During the Holocaust, however, 46,000 of Thessaloniki's Jews were sent to concentration camps, where 96% were murdered.

At the museum's groundbreaking in October 2024, German President Frank-Walter Steinmeier expressed Germany's commitment to preserving the memory of the atrocities, asserting, "The memory of what was done to the Jewish people on this site cannot be erased." Steinmeier joined Greek President Katerina Sakellaropoulou, Holocaust survivors, and other prominent individuals for the ceremony. One of these was Dr. Albert Bourla, CEO of Pfizer and the son of Holocaust survivors from Thessaloniki, who donated \$1 million for the museum's construction.

Today, Greece is home to about 5,000 Jews, with about 80% of those living in Athens. While physical violence against Jews is rare, Jewish cemeteries and Holocaust memorials are frequently vandalized.

Gaza Official: Israel's Secret Weapons "Vaporize" Human Bodies

In November, the head of Gaza's Ministry of Health accused the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) of using experimental weapons that vaporize bodies. He claimed that the IDF used "internationally prohibited weapons" to completely vaporize "1,410 families, numbering 5,444 people" in the past year.

Dr. Munir al-Bursh, Director General of the Ministry of Health in Gaza, is fre-



quently cited by mainstream media as an authoritative source. Thus, it was surprising when he claimed that the IDF was using weapons that vaporized anybody within 650 feet, perhaps explaining the Health Ministry's incredible (and unsubstantiated) casualty figures.

"Israel is testing weapons on us that we do not recognize," al-Bursh asserted.
"They drop bombs with terrifying sounds, and when a person gets within 650–980 feet of them, they vaporize.

"The Israeli army bombs entire residential blocks, wiping out all their inhabitants, and we only find out about them a day or two later. When these weapons are used on residential buildings, they reduce them to small fragments and rubble. We urgently need an international investigation committee to uncover what 'Israel' is doing to us," added al-Bursh.

Dr. Khalil Al-Daqran, spokesman for Al-Aqsa Martyrs Hospital, also claimed that the weapons caused some bodies to vaporize while lying in hospital beds.

Jewish, Israeli Americans Face "Substantial" Hiring Bias JNS.org

Jewish Americans and Israeli Americans face "substantial" discrimination in the labor market, according to a recent study by the Anti-Defamation League (ADL).

Compared to Americans from Western European backgrounds applying for the same role, Jewish American job seekers needed to send 24% more applications to receive the same number of positive first responses from prospective employers. Israeli Americans required 39% more applications.

In the study, Bryan Tomlin, a labor economist and professor of economics at California State University Channel Islands (northwest of Los Angeles), submitted 3,000 applications to online administrative assistant job postings across the U.S. He used identical email text and resumés that differed only in the applicant's name — selected to sound Jewish, Israeli, or Western European — and resumé signals of likely Jewish, Israeli, or Western European background.

"This study shows that Jewish and Israeli Americans may be missing out on job opportunities just because of their identity, not their qualifications, and it provides a start toward quantifying some of these more subtle but still harmful symptoms of anti-Semitism," Tomlin explained.

Because the applications focused on administrative positions, it is unknown how the results might apply to other jobs. The ADL stated that the study warrants further investigation of potential anti-Jewish and anti-Israeli prejudice in other markets.








Archaeology Unique Cave Pearl

Unique Cave Pearls Discovered in Israel

Researchers in Israel have discovered 50 rare cave pearls, some of which contain ancient Greek artifacts from the Hellenistic era, in an underground water system near Jerusalem. This is the first known instance of cave pearls containing man-made objects.

The discovery occurred in the Ain Joweizeh spring tunnel, a 761-foot-long water system believed to have been built between 900 B.C. and 586 B.C. Located southwest of Jerusalem's Old City, the tunnel is one of the longest in the region and was likely part of a royal estate.

What are cave pearls?

Cave pearls, round formations resembling pearls, are created when minerals build up around particles like sand grains. These formations require specific conditions to develop: mineral-rich water, water movement, and time. Unlike most mineral formations that can take thousands of years to form, cave pearls can develop within a few hundred years.



The cave pearls were found in a section of the tunnel carved directly into the bedrock. Researchers identified pottery shards and bits of plaster encapsulated in 16 of the 50 pearls.

Artifacts from the ancient Greek and Byzantine eras

The artifacts span several historical periods, including the Hellenistic (323–30 B.C.), Roman (63 B.C – A.D. 324), and early Byzantine (A.D. 330–636) eras. Some fragments are even older, dating back to the Middle Bronze Age II (around the 17th century B.C.).

Dr. Azriel Yechezkel, a lead researcher, noted the significance of the find. "Our initial research focused on mapping and surveying for archaeological artifacts within the spring tunnel. Cave pearls, a rare type of speleothem [mineral formations found inside caves], were not the primary objective of our investigation. The discovery of these formations — and even more surprisingly, the presence of archaeological remains like pottery shards within them — was an unexpected and significant find."


Notable discovery of cobalt-blue pottery

One notable discovery was pottery with a cobalt-blue glaze, a type of ceramic produced in places like Cyprus and Ephesus during the Hellenistic period. The experts believe that an imported lamp with this glaze may have belonged to an engineer who worked on constructing or maintaining the tunnel.


The Ain Joweizeh tunnel shows evidence of repeated use and repairs over the centuries. The tunnel's structure includes sections built with stone blocks and covered with stone slabs, while other parts are cut directly into the rock. Water from the spring tunnel flows northwest into a dry riverbed, eventually reaching the Refa'im stream.

Formation of the cave pearls

Researchers believe that the formation of these cave pearls began during the Hellenistic period. The constant flow of water in the tunnel likely caused the tiny particles within the pearls to roll, forming smooth, round shapes. The discovery also provides insights into how the water flow and environment in the tunnel changed over time.



The findings were published in the journal *Archaeometry.* ❖

Revised Egyptian Textbooks Show "Greatly Improved" Attitudes Toward Jews, Israel

Some 20 million Egyptian schoolchildren are studying from revised textbooks that seek to promote peace and tolerance, highlighting for the first time the historic Jewish presence in Egypt. A recent report from the Institute for Monitoring Peace and Cultural Tolerance in School

Education (IMPACT-se) revealed that 80% of Egyptian school-children are now studying under a reformed curriculum featuring "greatly improved" attitudes toward Jews and Israel.

Despite the changes in Egypt, Palestinian children continue to learn from textbooks that are rife with anti-Semitism and hatred of Israel.

The IMPACT-se study found "continued improvement in textbooks promoting peace, tolerance, and rejecting violence and extremism." Anti-Semitic and anti-Israel content that was revealed in previous reports has been removed or revised in the new material.

Egypt's fully revised curriculum for elementary schools is free of anti-Israel hatred, the report noted. Some Christian education textbooks also acknowledge the connection of Jews to Jerusalem and the Land of Israel — such as the existence of a Jewish Temple built by King Solomon in Jerusalem.

Israel is also presented as a legitimate peace partner.

Ninth-grade social studies students are required to memorize provisions of the Israel-Egypt peace treaty and outline the

"advantages of peace for Egypt and the Arab states," the study noted.

Peace-making is illustrated in the curriculum through the inclusion of a picture depicting the late Israeli premier Menachem Begin alongside the late Egyptian President Anwar Sadat.

Christians, especially Copts, are commended throughout textbooks with their contribution to Egypt's history and modern society emphasized.

While the updated elementary-level curriculum, where the majority of Egyptian school students study, has successfully eliminated hateful content, the unrevised materials for higher grades continue to include anti-Semitic and anti-Israel narratives, the study found.

Textbooks for higher grades are also scheduled for reform in the coming years.

"We are delighted to see the ongoing reforms taking place in the Egyptian curriculum, which mark significant progress," said IMPACT-se CEO Marcus Sheff. "These changes in the most populous Arab country with a long-standing landmark peace agreement with Israel, are of real importance to the region's future."

"Hey Abdul, I'm here and waiting. Send me a few of your best," the Israeli said.


The Syrian commander angrily ordered a group of infantry to attack.

Enraged, the Syrian commander turned to his top colonel and told him to take a platoon of tanks and kill the pest.


